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Description of activity

Weekly instrumental lessons delivered in special schools and other educational settings by a specialist SFE teacher. These are often in classrooms or designated spaces. Lessons are delivered with a variety of group sizes and involving children with varied additional needs.

Initial risk rating

The rating relates to the likelihood of risk of infection, as well the severity of consequences as it is currently perceived. It should be noted that this severity score for Covid-19 will vary according to factors such as age and additional underlying conditions, such as asthma, diabetes, etc. For the purposes of an overall viewpoint, an average score has been estimated. 1 = Least Likely/Severe, 5 = Most Likely/Severe.

Additional control measures

A summary is below, with full details contained in the SFE Guidance for Schools document. These measures are in line with latest HM Government guidance. If Birmingham moves into the Very High category (Tier 3), this will trigger an immediate further review.

Everyone	 Additional control measures If possible, pupils are to make their own way to lessons or brought to lessons by school staff and not be collected by SFE teachers. SFE staff are advised to wear facemasks in corridors/communal areas of schools. Groups are to be arranged within existing school bubbles. Spaces used should have adequate ventilation (including between lessons) SFE teachers to maintain a safe social distance of 1-2m minimum at all times. Where adequate social distancing is at risk of being compromised additional PPE such as face shields may be used. Vocal, woodwind and brass teachers to additionally use supplied PPE equipment when needed (face visors for demonstration/reduction of risk). Pupils and the SFE teacher to be positioned side-by-side or back-to-back. Close-up face-to face interactions and physical contact between SFE teacher and pupils to be avoided or minimised. Following DfE guidance (August 20th) – singing is perfectly safe in groupings of no more than 15 at a time (whole classes can be split into 2 groups of 15 and only half the class sings at any one time). It is important that singing is led carefully and by using sensible dynamics – no singing loudly. 	Who is responsible? SFE staff in liaison with the venue staff.
			 All pupils to wash their hands thoroughly before and after each lesson. Any SFE teachers showing signs of symptoms will not attend the school premises, nor return until they have been tested and received confirmation they do not have Covid-19. Any SFE teachers who have been contacted through 'test and trace' will not return to school until they have been tested and received confirmation they do not have Covid-19. 	
2	Surface transmission via	Everyone	 All instruments to be cleaned before use. SFE staff to use supplied PPE when setting up, or handling instruments. 	SFE staff in liaison with the venue staff.

	handling of instruments		 The handling of instruments by SFE teachers to be kept to a minimum by effective strategies and training of pupils and/or school support staff. All pupils to wash their hands thoroughly before and after each lesson. 	
			 Special considerations: Surfaces of shared instruments (e.g. piano, keyboards) or shared equipment (e.g. beaters, sticks) should be wiped before/after each usage. Pupils using sticks/beaters should bring/use their equipment where possible. The skins of percussion instruments played by hand should be wiped between usage. 	
3	Surface transmission via resources and other equipment	Everyone	 SFE teachers to minimise the handling of resources by send new resources via email to school staff or directly to parents. Pupils to play standing up, sitting on the floor or in their own wheelchair if possible to minimise the touching of furniture, etc. 	SFE staff in liaison with the venue and parents.
