



Health for Life 10 Year Anniversary Award

The opportunity to bid for an award is open to all *Health for Life* primary schools – cohorts 1-9 inclusive. Schools should submit their application by March 31st 2022

School's Commitment

In applying for the 10 Year Anniversary Award, your school is committing to the following:

- To use the grant only for the purpose of the *Health for Life* project: the school may add their own funding to supplement the project if appropriate.
- To complete the project within the timeframe if successful in obtaining one of the grants
- To provide evidence of progress and completion when requested to Services For Education
- To support PR coverage
- To notify Service For Education should any problems occur in completing project.

The Award Process

Submission

The submission comprises two parts - a video or videoed PowerPoint presentation (3 mins max) **and** a written form.

The overall submission must:

- a) demonstrate the school's continued commitment to Health for Life
- b) include pupils, teachers and family 'voice' in the submission, in one or both parts i.e. video and /or written form
- c) be completed by named project leader/key contact and must have headteacher endorsement.

The proposed project should be:

- a new development and not a refreshment or update of any element previously funded through the *Health for Life* programme
- sustainable and benefit existing and future pupils
- able to be completed within one year by no later than the end of May 2023.

Part 1: Video or videoed PowerPoint presentation element; 3 mins max

Schools should provide a link to a video presentation to showcase highlights of what the school has achieved through their involvement in the original *Health for Life* programme, addressing key questions:

- 1. What has been the programme's most significant impact on the school?
- 2. How has the school maintained each of the key strands (food growing; healthy eating/cookery; physical activity)?
- 3. How have parents /families continued to be involved?

Photos and quotes from staff and pupils should be included. You should supply a link to the video on the Award Submission Form. Please ensure that you have written permission from either a parent or carer that their child can appear in these photos/videos.

Part 2: Written submission

Schools should complete the application form outlining their proposed project to develop *Health for Life* further, focusing on one of the three strands (food growing; healthy eating/cookery; physical activity)

Timescale

Applications must be submitted by email to Services For Education by **March 31st 2022.** Entries will be judged by a panel from Mondelez and Services For Education, and successful applicants will be notified in May 2022 with the grants being awarded in September 2022. The project should be completed by May 2023.

Awarding Criteria

The opportunity to bid for an award is open to all *Health for Life* primary schools – cohorts 1-9 inclusive.

Submission should be fully completed, meeting all the basic outline criteria details. Schools should be willing to provide extra details if requested.

Judges will be looking in particular for evidence that:

- 1. the submission has whole school support i.e. strong endorsement from the senior leadership team and governors; pupils and families have been involved in the submission process
- 2. the original HfL programme has been firmly embedded in school culture and activities have been continued
- 3. the proposed project fits the *Health for Life* ethos and
 - will be sustainable
 - meets a need and will benefit existing and future pupils
 - the project's scale and costs justify the award
 - will be completed within the timeframe
